POLLEN ALLERGY

Each spring, summer, and fall, tiny particles are released from trees, weeds, and grasses. These particles, known as pollen, hitch rides on currents of air. Although their mission is to fertilize parts of other plants, many never reach their targets.

Instead, they enter human noses and throats, triggering a type of seasonal allergic rhinitis called pollen allergy, which many people know as hay fever or rose fever (depending on the season in which the symptoms occur).

Of all the things that can cause an allergy, pollen is one of the most widespread. Many of the foods, drugs, or animals that cause allergies can be avoided to a great extent; even insects and household dust are escapable. Short of staying indoors when the pollen count is high – and even that may not help – there is no easy way to evade windborne pollen.

People with pollen allergies often develop sensitivities to other troublemakers that are present all year, such as dust mites. For these allergy sufferers, the "sneezin' season" has no limit. Year-round airborne allergens cause perennial allergic rhinitis, as distinguished from seasonal allergic rhinitis.

WHAT IS POLLEN?

Plants produce microscopic round or oval pollen grains to reproduce. In some species, the plant uses the pollen from its own flowers to fertilize itself. Other types must be cross-pollinated; that



is, in order for fertilization to take place and seeds to form, pollen must be transferred from the flower of one plant to that of another plant of the same species. Insects do this job for certain flowering plants, while other plants rely on wind transport.

The types of pollen that most commonly cause allergic reactions are produced by the plain-looking plants (trees, grasses, and weeds) that do not have showy flowers. These plants manufacture small, light, dry pollen granules that are custom-made for wind transport. Samples of ragweed pollen have been collected 400 miles out at sea and 2 miles high in the air. Because airborne pollen is carried for long distances, it does little good to rid an area of an offending plant – the pollen can drift in from many miles away. In addition, most allergenic pollen comes from plants that produce it in huge quantities. A single ragweed plant can generate a million grains of pollen a day.

The chemical makeup of pollen is the basic factor that determines whether it is likely to

cause hay fever. For example, pine tree pollen is produced in large amounts by a common tree, which would make it a good candidate for causing allergy. The chemical composition of pine pollen, however, appears to make it less allergenic than other types. Because pine pollen is heavy, it tends to fall straight down and does not scatter. Therefore, it rarely reaches human noses.

Among North American plants, weeds are the most prolific producers of allergenic pollen. Ragweed is the major culprit, but others of importance are sagebrush, redroot pigweed, lamb's quarters, Russian thistle (tumbleweed), and English plantain.

Grasses and trees, too, are important sources of allergenic pollens. Although more than 1,000 species of grass grow in North America, only a few produce highly allergenic pollen. These include Timothy grass, Kentucky bluegrass, Johnson grass, Bermuda grass, redtop grass, orchard grass, and sweet vernal grass. Trees that produce allergenic pollen include oak, ash, elm, hickory, pecan, box elder, and mountain cedar.

It is common to hear people say that they are allergic to colorful or scented flowers like roses. In fact, only florists, gardeners, and others who have prolonged, close contact with flowers are likely to become sensitized to pollen from these plants. Most people have little contact with the large, heavy, waxy pollen grains of many flowering plants because this type of pollen is not carried by wind but by insects such as butterflies and bees.

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RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

Gulf South Health Plans members who are receiving mental health or substance abuse treatment may have questions about their rights as consumers of these services. Mental health and substance abuse treatment is managed by Behavioral Health Managed Care Services (BHMCS), a division of General Health System. BHMCS developed this list of member rights and responsibilities to inform members about their rights. If you have any questions about BHMCS services, please call BHMCS at (225) 381-6500 or (800) 262-8601 Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM for additional information.

Member Rights

Members are assured specific rights by the laws of the state where they receive services, and also are assured rights by BHMCS policy.

- All members have the right to be treated with respect and recognition of their dignity and their need for privacy.
- All members have the right to the following information about BHMCS: a description of its services, the scope of member benefits, information regarding professional qualifications of participating practitioners, procedures for obtaining referrals to BHMCS network panel providers, and an explanation of each member's rights and responsibilities.
- All members have the right to a formal complaint/appeal process.
- All members have the right to participate in decision-making regarding their health care.
- All members have the right to a candid discussion of appropriate or medically necessary treatment options for their conditions, regardless of cost or benefit coverage.

Member Responsibilities

By consenting to mental health or substance abuse treatment, the BHMCS member agrees to assume responsibilities as defined in the contract or the policy and procedure. Each member is given a copy of these responsibilities.

- All members agree to advise BHMCS concerning any pre-existing conditions, and

while enrolled, they agree to advise BHMCS of changes in enrollment status and any other situations in which their eligibility may be affected.

- All members agree to follow BHMCS procedures for precertification of requested outpatient and inpatient services.
- All members who accept referrals to a provider from BHMCS are responsible for scheduling their own appointments for clinical services.
- All members who consent to treatment services agree to, as much as they can, provide information professional staff need in order to care for the member, try to understand their problem, help make treatment goals, and follow the treatment plan developed with BHMCS and their provider. Failure to follow the treatment plan may result in non-payment of claims or other sanctions as stipulated in the specific health plan document.
- All members are responsible for keeping their scheduled appointments with providers. Members should notify their clinician 24 hours in advance when canceling an appointment. Uncanceled appointments are

not reimbursed by BHMCS and may be charged at the provider's full fee.

- For the assessment or treatment of minor children, BHMCS and providers can obtain consent only from the child's custodial parent or legal guardian. By consenting to treatment, parents and guardians agree to cooperate and participate in their child's treatment. Guardianship must be established before clinical referral can occur except in an emergency.
- The decision to terminate treatment is made by the patient and/or the provider. When a patient decides not to return to treatment, the patient must notify BHMCS before beginning treatment with a new provider. BHMCS may not authorize transfers to other providers or new services unless termination has occurred.
- If members wish to complain about denial of a claim payment, a denial of authorization of services, or dissatisfaction with services provided, the complaint must be initiated within 60 days from the date of the incident that caused them concern.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Mental health and substance abuse treatment for Gulf South Health Plans members is managed by Behavioral Health Managed Care Services (BHMCS), a division of General Health System. Since many members want to know how to obtain mental health and substance abuse treatment, BHMCS developed these Frequently Asked Questions to assist members in obtaining these services. A review of the following questions and answers will provide all of the necessary information needed to begin treatment. Please note that these answers are for managed care members only, not employee assistance program members. Each member's individual contract will identify the type of services available to the member.

Q How do I get mental health or chemical dependency treatment?

A Call (225) 381-6500 or (800) 262-8601 Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM to obtain authorization for mental health or chemical dependency treatment. If your plan requires a referral from your primary care physician for mental health or chemical dependency treatment, call your primary care physician first. If you are not sure, call us at the above numbers. All mental health and chemical dependency treatment must be authorized by Behavioral Health Managed Care Services (BHMCS) before treatment is received.

Q What should I do in an emergency?

A If you are being treated by a mental health or chemical dependency clinician, call your clinician and follow his/her instructions. If you are not currently being treated, call us at (800) 262-8601, any day at any time.

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PREVENTIVE HEALTH



Preventive Health is a top priority at Gulf South Health Plans. The age group discussed in this issue are the 25 and older. We adopted these guidelines based on national scientific agencies and have added local needs. These guidelines are reviewed and updated annually when new recommendations are received from agencies such as the Center for Disease Control, the American Academy of Pediatrics, Family Practitioners and OB/GYNs, and the US Preventive Services Task Force. A copy of these guidelines has been sent to all primary care physicians.

WHEN DO PLANTS MAKE POLLEN?

One of the most obvious features of pollen allergy is its seasonal nature – people experience its symptoms only when the pollen grains to which they are allergic are in the air. Each plant has a pollinating period that is more or less the same from year to year. Exactly when a plant starts to pollinate seems to depend on the relative length of night and day – and therefore on geographical location – rather than on the

weather. (On the other hand, weather conditions during pollination can affect the amount of pollen produced and distributed in a specific year.) Thus, the farther north you go, the later the pollinating period and the later the allergy season.

A pollen count, which is familiar to many people from local weather reports, is a measure of how much pollen is in the air. This count represents the concentration of all the pollen (or of one particular type, like ragweed) in the air in a certain area at a specific time. It is expressed in grains of pollen per square meter of air collected

over 24 hours. Pollen counts tend to be highest early in the morning on warm, dry, breezy days and lowest during chilly, wet periods. Although a pollen count is an approximate and fluctuating measure, it is useful as a general guide for when it is advisable to stay indoors and avoid contact with the pollen.

Appointment Accessibility

Gulf South Health Plans' Quality Improvement Committee has approved the following Access Standards for appointments with your primary care physician. As part of our continuing efforts to improve the quality of care provided to our members, provider compliance with these standards will be monitored.

Routine Care - Members with routine care needs should be seen within 4-6 weeks. Examples of care defined as routine are immunizations, pap smears and pelvic exams, well care or complete physicals.

Non-Urgent Care/Symptomatic - Members with Non-Urgent Care/Symptomatic needs should be seen within 2-5 days. These needs are defined as problems which do not substantially restrict a member's normal activity but could develop if left untreated; i.e. chronic conditions, changes in integument of the skin (moles or lesions), discovered lumps or pain of unknown etiology, redness or itching in the eye.

Urgent Care - Members with urgent needs should be seen within 24-48 hours. Examples of urgent care needs (those that are not life-threatening but could result in serious disability or injury unless medical attention is received) are: high fever (in relation to age and condition), fractures, severe pain, animal bites, sudden onset of eye pain or blurred vision, or do substantially restrict a member's normal activity (infectious illness, respiratory ailments, flu).

Emergency Care - Members with emergency needs should have immediate access, 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. Emergency Care is defined as medical situations, which during time of occurrence, a member or responsible individual would reasonably believe the member's life or the life of a dependent to be in danger, that permanent disability or loss of limb might result if the condition is left untreated. Examples of this are: severe bleeding, severe trauma, loss of consciousness, seizures, chest pain, poisoning, foreign body in eye or a puncture wound to the eye, etc.

Please keep these guidelines in mind when requesting assistance from your physician's office in scheduling appointments for various medical needs.

HEPATITIS CAN BE PREVENTED

There are two forms of viral hepatitis which can be prevented by vaccination, hepatitis A and hepatitis B. Hepatitis A is a virus spread by oral fecal contact. Put differently, you are at risk if you eat or drink something contaminated with human feces. There was a recent outbreak of hepatitis A in the United States due to strawberries imported from Mexico. Human feces were used as fertilizer and the strawberries were shipped across the nation. Improperly washed berries caused cases of hepatitis A in California, Minnesota, New Orleans and Texas.

Other risk factors for hepatitis A include traveling to third world countries. These countries often have poor sanitation which leads to high rates of hepatitis A. Even staying in a resort hotel is not protective. If the cook does not wash his or her hands after a bowel movement, he can contaminate your food. For this reason, hepatitis A vaccine is suggested for all people traveling to third world countries. Other groups that should be vaccinated for hepatitis A are those with chronic liver disease such as hepatitis C and male homosexuals.

Hepatitis B spreads via blood and body fluids. As an example, it can be spread from a hepatitis B positive mother to her baby as the baby is being born. In the United States, the most common form of transmission is sexual, but can also be associated with having tattoos done with dirty needles, intravenous drug use, and providing first aid to bleeding victims. This last risk factor is the reason that the hepatitis B vaccine is now recommended for all healthcare providers, including first aid responders or anyone else who may contact blood contaminated needles. Hepatitis B is also recommended for all infants and adolescents, and people with chronic liver disease, especially cirrhosis.

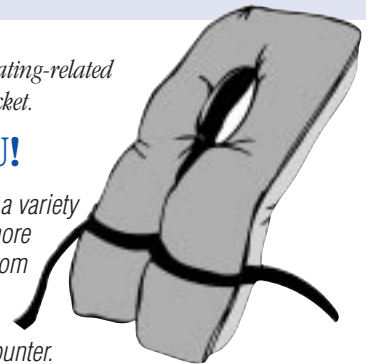

THE RIGHT LIFE JACKET FOR YOU!

Life jackets are personal flotation devices (PFDs) and come in a variety of shapes, colors, sizes and materials. Some are made to be more rugged and last longer, while others are made to protect you from cold water. No matter which life jacket you choose, be sure to get the one that is right for you. Select a PFD based on your planned activities, and the water conditions you expect to encounter.

Remember, spending a little time now can save your life later. United States Coast Guard (USCG) approval means that the PFD has passed rigorous testing. So, always look for the USCG approval number on any life jacket you buy. Be sure to read the manufacturer's label and the "Think Safe" pamphlet that is attached to the device. Valuable information is contained within these resources.



FACTS AND FICTION ABOUT SINUSITIS

Sinus problems affect an estimated 30 to 35 million Americans - making sinus problems one of the most common complaints of patients seeking medical attention.

Sinusitis simply means inflammation of the sinuses, but this gives little indication of the misery and pain this condition can cause.

Chronic sinusitis, sinusitis that persists for at least 3 weeks, affects an estimated 32 million people in the United States. Americans spend millions of dollars each year for medications that promise relief from their sinus symptoms.

Sinuses are hollow air spaces, of which there are many in the human body. When people say, "I'm having a sinus attack," they usually are referring to symptoms in one or more of four pairs of cavities, or spaces, known as paranasal sinuses. These cavities, located within the skull or bones of the head surrounding the nose, include the frontal sinuses over the eyes in the brow area; the maxillary sinuses inside each cheekbone; the ethmoids just behind the bridge of the nose and between the eyes; and behind them, the sphenoids in the upper region of the nose and behind the eyes.

Each sinus has an opening into the nose for the free exchange of air and mucus, and each is joined with the nasal passages by a continuous mucous membrane lining. Therefore, anything that causes a swelling in the nose – an infection or an allergic reaction – can also affect the sinuses. Air trapped within an obstructed sinus, along with pus or other secretions, may cause pressure on the sinus wall. The result is the sometimes intense pain of a sinus attack. Similarly, when air is prevented from entering a paranasal sinus by a swollen membrane at the opening, a vacuum can be created that also causes pain.

Normally, the nose and sinuses produce between a pint and a quart of mucus secretions per day. This passes into and through the nose, picking up dust particles, bacteria and other air pollutants along the way. The mucus is swept to the back of the throat by millions of tiny hairlike structures (cilia), which line the nasal cavity; and is swallowed. In the stomach, acids destroy any dangerous bacteria. Most people do not notice this mucus flow because it is just a normal bodily function.

SYMPTOMS

Sinus infection can be divided into two types, acute (severe) and chronic (on-going) sinusitis.

Acute Sinusitis: If a cold becomes worse, acute sinusitis may develop. You should see a doctor if you experience the following:

- Green/yellow nasal discharge
- Facial pressure around the cheeks, eyes, and forehead, especially with swelling
- High fever (102° F and above)
- Upper molar tooth pain

Chronic Sinusitis: Patients with chronic sinus infections probably have had one or many prior episodes of acute sinus infection, which have failed to be cured. They may also complain of having a continuous cold. Common symptoms include:

- Low grade fever (less than 101° F)
- Nasal congestion/nosebleed
- Headaches
- Chronic sore throat and cough
- Poor, decreased, or absent sense of smell
- Bad breath

WHAT CAUSES SINUS PROBLEMS?

When the openings into the sinuses become plugged up, sinus pressure develops and the nose may feel blocked. These blockages may be caused by infections, irritants, anatomic (physical) problems, and allergies. Sinus disease can be common among family members, and stress may play a role in chronic sinus diseases.

INFECTIONS

Most adults get colds and upper respiratory infections about three times per year. Children get them more frequently. Bacterial infections often follow the common cold. When the mucus changes from clear to yellow or green, it usually means a bacterial infection has developed. Bacteria and bacterial infections cause swelling of the tissues inside the nose and thickening of the normal mucous. This slows down or even stops proper sinus drainage

Acute Sinusitis - Sometimes, fungal infections can cause acute sinusitis. Although these organisms are abundant in the environment, they usually are harmless to healthy people, indicating that the human body has a natural resistance to them. Fungi, such as *Aspergillus*, can cause serious illness in people whose immune systems are not functioning

properly. Some people with fungal sinusitis have an allergic-type reaction to the fungi.

Acute sinusitis is much more common in certain patients than in the general population. For example, sinusitis occurs more often in patients with reduced immune function (such as patients with immune deficiencies and HIV infection) and with abnormality of mucus secretion or mucus movement (such as cystic fibrosis and diseases of abnormal cilia [Kartagener's syndrome]).

Chronic Sinusitis - Chronic sinusitis refers to inflammation of the sinuses that continues for at least 3 weeks, but often continues for months or even years.

As noted above, allergies are frequently associated with chronic sinusitis. Patients with asthma have a particularly high frequency of chronic sinusitis. Inhalation of airborne allergens (substances that provoke an allergic reaction), such as dust, mold, and pollen, often set off allergic reactions (allergic rhinitis) that, in turn, may contribute to sinusitis. People who are allergic to fungi can develop a condition called "allergic fungal sinusitis."

Damp weather, especially in northern temperate climates, or pollutants in the air and in buildings also can affect people subject to chronic sinusitis.

IRRITANTS

Air pollution, smoke, and chemical irritants (e.g., some sprays containing pesticides, disinfectants, and household detergents) may cause swelling and blockage of the narrow channels from the nose to the sinuses, leading to bacterial growth and sinus infection.

ANATOMIC PROBLEMS

In some people, the cartilage and bone in the center of the nose (called the septum) can be shifted to one side through injury while others may be born that way. If this shift is severe, sinus drainage on that side of the nose can be affected. This can lead to complete closure of one or several of the sinus channels. Mucus then builds up behind these obstructions and causes sinus infection. If the swelling becomes severe, the lining of the sinuses can grow excessively. These growths are called polyps, which can cause further blockage of the sinus channels. Trapped or stagnant mucus provides a breeding ground for bacteria.

1 (5 ounce) can lobster, drained and flaked
2 tablespoons lemon juice
3/4 cup celery, sliced
1/3 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 avocados, peeled and halved
1 dash pepper
Lemon juice

2 small tomatoes, diced
1 cup pickled okra, sliced
1/4 cup onions, minced
1/4 cup celery, minced
1/4 cup red bell pepper, minced
1/4 cup yellow bell pepper, minced
1/4 cup green bell pepper, minced
1 tablespoon, garlic, chopped
1 cup fat-free mayonnaise
1 cup fat-free sour cream
1/2 cup ketchup
2 tablespoons Creole mustard
1/4 cup oil
Salt, pepper, hot sauce to taste

Combine vegetables and toss lightly. Mix sugar, oil, vinegar, and pepper and pour over vegetables. Toss lightly. Cover and chill several hours or overnight. Drain and serve.

BICYCLE HELMETS –

Does my child really need one?

The easiest question to answer: yes. Laws now require helmets in many areas. That is because medical research shows that 88% of cyclists' brain injuries can be prevented by a bicycle helmet.

Which one should I buy?

There are many good helmets on the market. Consumer Reports tested helmets in June of 1997. Their report has only a few models rated. But in fact you can choose based on the standard the helmet meets, how well it fits your child and whether or not your child likes it. Inside each helmet will be stickers telling you which impact standards it meets. The old ANSI 1984 standard is inadequate. An ASTM standard sticker is the minimum you should look for. A Snell Memorial Foundation sticker means the helmet has been independently tested by Snell and meets their more stringent standard. The standards are policed by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, whose own standard is the legal requirement from March, 1999 on. The CPSC standard is generally stronger than the others, so look for a CPSC sticker in anything you buy from now on, even if it costs a little more than an older model.

Warning: No Helmets on Playgrounds!

In February, 1999, the first strangulation incident in the US involving a bike helmet on playground equipment occurred. Be sure to teach your child to remove their helmet before using playground equipment or climbing trees!

TREATMENT

After diagnosing sinusitis and identifying a possible cause, a doctor can prescribe a course of treatment that will reduce the inflammation and relieve the symptoms.

Acute sinusitis is treated by re-establishing drainage of the nasal passages, controlling or eliminating the source of the inflammation, and relieving the pain. Doctors generally recommend decongestants to reduce the congestion, antibiotics to control a bacterial

infection, if present, and pain relievers to reduce the pain.

Over-the-counter and prescription decongestant nose drops and sprays, however, should not be used for more than a few days. When used for longer periods, these drugs can lead to even more congestion and swelling of the nasal passages.

Most patients with sinusitis that is caused by bacteria can be treated successfully with antibiotics used along with a nasal or oral decongestant. An antibiotic that fights the

bacteria most commonly associated with sinusitis is the initial treatment recommended.

Many cases of acute sinusitis resolve without antibiotics. However, patients with underlying allergic disease, and infectious sinusitis, need to be treated to relieve their allergy symptoms. Patients with asthma and infectious sinusitis often have exacerbations of asthma which need to be treated. Many physicians feel that some patients with severe asthma have dramatic symptom improvement when their chronic sinusitis is treated with antibiotics.

Q What if I am out of town or out of state and want to arrange mental health or chemical dependency treatment?

A For routine care, call (800) 262-8601 Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. For emergency care, call any day at any time. Remember, even if you are out of town, all mental health and chemical dependency treatment must be authorized by BHMCS before treatment is received.

Q How do I change clinicians or see an additional clinician?

A Call (225) 381-6500 or (800) 262-8601 Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. A BHMCS clinician will talk with you about your needs and will assist you in planning your treatment.

Q What will I have to pay for my treatment?

A This varies from contract to contract. In general, most of the costs of treatment may be paid by BHMCS. You should plan to pay some of the costs of treatment, especially if inpatient care is required. Call BHMCS at (225) 381-6500 or (800) 262-8601 to discuss the coverage your benefit plan offers. Don't wait until after you receive a bill to find out about your financial obligations for treatment.

Q What are some examples of expenses that I might have to pay for mental health and chemical dependency treatment?

A This is a list of the types of payments that could be required by your plan:

- annual deductible (an amount that must be paid before your insurance begins to pay for your treatment)
- co-payment for each visit or inpatient day (an amount paid by the member for each visit or inpatient day)
- payment for missed scheduled appointments (missed appointments are not covered by BHMCS)
- lifetime limit on the amount of money allowed by your plan to pay for services provided to you (benefit)

Q Is one type of mental health and chemical dependency treatment more expensive than another?

A The more intensive the type of treatment, the more it will cost the member. Inpatient (24 hour) mental health and chemical dependency treatment will cost a member more than day programs or outpatient treatment.

Q What if I am not satisfied with a decision BHMCS has made about paying for my care?

A These decisions are called utilization management decisions. If you disagree with a utilization management decision, you have the right to appeal that decision. If you are in treatment at the time authorization for payment was discontinued, you have the right to an expedited appeal within 24 hours.

Q How long do I have to appeal when I disagree with the utilization management decision?

A There are time limits on how long you can wait to appeal a utilization management decision. Generally, you must appeal within 30 days of receipt of the BHMCS decision not to pay for a service. To make an appeal, call Customer Relations at (225) 381-6800.

Q How do I complain or make a suggestion to improve services to BHMCS?

A BHMCS welcomes complaints and suggestions. Feedback from our members and their families helps us to improve our services. If you have complaints or suggestions, call BHMCS Customer Relations at (225) 381-6800.
